Many Thanks to the judges for the May competition: Carl Hebert, Mike Thomas, and Tom Cuchara.


ART ANDERSON DESIGNATED AS MNEC

Flagpole Photographer Art Anderson has been designated as a Master Member by the New England Camera Club Council. Each year NECCC bestows this award on a maximum of 5 photographers "...who have performed exceptional service for the Council during a period of not less than five years, and/or have substantially advanced photography in the New England area through lecturing, teaching, judging, and through other administrative activities in photographic organizations for the same period." Currently there is a total of well over 1000 NECCC member photographers.

Art was one of the founders of Flagpole Photographers in 1985 and over many years has served as educator, judge, lecturer, and NECCC representative. His landscape and still life photography has been exhibited in numerous galleries and juried competitions and recognized through many awards. Additionally, he is known as one of the major B&W wet darkroom printers in New England. Congratulations on a well-deserved honor, Art Anderson, MNEC!

MAY'S PROGRAM

Tom and Lisa Cuchara presented their program "An African Safari." Tom described his inspiration for this photo trip: the Johnny Weismiller movies. He wanted to experience the nature and wildlife of Africa through the senses: the smells as in a farmer's field, the sounds of wild animals in the absence of the noise of trucks and motorcycles, and the interactions of wild animals among their own and with other species, including the tensions. In particular, he was interested in the lion in its natural environment: hiding in grassy fields, relating to family, stalking prey, making the kill.

And so this dream of a photo trip became a reality for 17 days in March of 1993 at a Maasai game preserve in Kenya. He and Lisa recorded what they saw with the 28-105 and 300 mm Canon lenses and subsequently composed their photo story set with music via Pro Show Gold. The images were all recorded in film and later on scanned into digital files. Thus we were privy to the realization of Tom's dream, including: a new-born giraffe with umbilical cord, the black rhino, the red-eyed crocodile, lions hidden in fields of tall grasses near a school yard where children were playing soccer, a lioness on the hunt, lions attacking and eating buffalo, animals playing, sparring, stalking, attacking, and nurturing.

The group of photographers traveled by truck throughout the natural environment, at times going uphill over boulders (forget photographing then). They tripped their shutters mostly from inside the truck since their guide would only stop for them to get out when the grass was but a couple of inches high. Tom recommends that anyone taking such a trip go with as small a group as possible since it can get crowded with a group of photographers cramped inside a truck trying to get the shots.

We were mesmerized as we connected with what Tom and Lisa saw, felt, and recorded through their extraordinary nature photography. Many thanks, Tom and Lisa!
