March 6th, 2014 **Guest Speaker - Mark Bowie**

Mark Bowie featured his "Night of Northeast" presentation. Displaying a slide show of his ambitious projects of photographing New York State and New England at night. While sharing the thought processes and techniques used to produce spectacular nocturnal images of the region's mountains, woods, waters, cities, villages and coasts. In addition, he covered equipment considerations, determining nighttime exposures, focusing in the dark, "painting" with artificial light, photographing fireworks, long exposures, multiple exposures, timed intervals and time lapse sequences. This program night was proven to be truly educational and fun by photographers of all skill levels.
