Our first meeting boasted a heavy turnout and resulted in several new members including:



NEWTOWN AND BEYOND PHOTOGRAPHY EXHIBIT

The big buzz for our September meeting was preparation for the launch of the largest exhibit of members' work in the club's history. Newtown and Beyond, a collaboration of Flagpole Photographers and the Town of Newtown/Office of First Selectman Pat Llodra represents the culmination of months of work by co-chairwomen Rhonda Cullens and Win Brickmeier.

The exhibit, which at press time is now a reality, runs from October 17 through November 12 in the Newtown Municipal Center on the campus of Fairfield Hills. The exhibit may be viewed during regular business hours Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

A total of 209 photographs by 28 members are on display in the art gallery inspired space of the new Municipal Center. The show features photographs with a Newtown theme as well as favorites of club members.



An opening reception coordinated by Town Clerk Debbie Aurelia was held on October 17 featuring live music from classical guitarist Peter Obre and autumn florals from Hollandia Nursery. A refreshment table featured sweet treats from Andrea's Bakery and Big Y as well as offerings from Flagpole members. A big thank you goes out to our club members who volunteered at the event. Club vice-president Donna White offered a presentation of potential field trips. Field trip possibilities included Magic Wings Butterfly Conservatory in Deerfield, MA as well as other opportunities closer to home such as Roxbury Land Trust Preserves, Huntington and Southford Falls State Park, Aspetuck Land Trust/Trout Brook Valley and Saugatuck Reservoir Trails. The potential to gain entry into some of the abandoned buildings at Fairfield Hills was also mentioned as a possibility.

A perennial shortage of nature images for the NECCC Electronic Competition led to a call for members to submit 1-3 of their best images for consideration for the fall competition. Even if not selected for the fall competition, members' images may still be chosen for the 2011 winter or spring competitions. Specs for sizing digital image files per NECCC: Photographs will be projected using a projector having 1024 pixels in the horizontal direction and 768 pixels in the vertical direction. Pictures must fit within those dimensions. Therefore, images must be no more than 768 pixels tall and no more than 1024 pixels wide. It is suggested (though not a requirement) that entries be saved with the proper amount of compression so that the files do not exceed 350kb. Save your image as a jpeg with a quality of between 7 and 9. A jpeg quality of 8 is usually sufficient. It is strongly suggested that all photographs be converted to the sRGB color space. If anyone has difficulty with sizing images, you can send it to Anne Eigen or Rick Tyrseck at the original size saved as a jpeg for resizing to NECCC specifications.


