It's time to start planning that early spring shoot and rummaging through your photographic archives! Flagpole's annual members' exhibit and competition will take place during the month of April in our meeting room at the Booth Library.

Each member may submit up to six images: three color and three black and white. Judging will take place on April 2 and all photos will be on exhibit through the month of April.

In addition to Best in Show, other awards will include first, second and third place and honorable mention in the categories of "traditional", "digitally enhanced" and "black and white". Awards in the special categories Dave Kriger Nature Award, Jeannette

Talarino Flower Award, Bruce Allen Open Print Award and the Peoples' Choice Award will also be given.

Thanks again to Ed Stoller for the upgrade to our light box. Painting the box a neutral 18% gray yielded excellent results during our monthly competition.

There's still time to check out our own Ercole Gaudioso's photo exhibit at the Woodbury Public Library. The exhibit runs through February.

JANUARY'S PROGRAM

Bill Snellings, Bob Berthier, Frank Gardner and Bill Marcy gave a presentation on their recent photo trip to Yellowstone and Grand Tetons National Parks. They shared a slideshow of their spectacular and inspiring images of wildlife and beautiful landscapes in magnificent light, as well as valuable travel and photographic tips.

They advise that the optimal time to visit is September and/or October for several reasons. The summer tourists have gone home, the temperature has cooled and the animals are in prime condition for photography, as their coats have thickened in anticipation of winter and they are very active.

They recommend traveling lightly and taking only essential photographic equipment: a medium-range zoom (around 18-200mm), a longer zoom (80-400mm), batteries, chargers and memory cards.

For an eight-day trip, they report a total cost of \$1400 per person that included round-trip airfare, food, double-occupancy lodging, car rental and gas.

NECCC ELECTRONIC INTERCLUB COMPETITION RESULTS

In Pictorial Class B Rui DeSousa earned a third place for his image "The 480", with Flagpole coming in 13th out of 26 total clubs.

In Nature Class B Bob Berthier took an honorable mention for "Snack", which puts Flagpole in 9th place of 25 clubs.

Although not applicable to any of the Flagpole entries, the NECCC report listed some issues that might be of interest to members for future reference as the Glennie Nature Salon Competition approaches:

"A total of five Nature images (one in Nature A and four in Nature B) were disqualified during this competition session. The reasoning provided by the judges included image manipulation, domestic animal species and cultivated or hybrid specimens. All disqualified images were given a score of nine points. The judges also expressed concern regarding the use of heavy borders on images; especially Nature images."


