Fact 1


Backup must be

- 1. Easy
- 2. Cheap
- 3. Part of your digital workflow

Fact 2

There are many "right ways"

Fact 3 It is not a "one time" activity





Choose your style of backup

Start small and extend over time - it's a continuum

Passive

- ✓ Time, Cost & Complexity all zero
- ✓ Side effect of sharing photos

Examples

Photo competition

- Image on website
- Print image in your closet

Facebook, Instagram, Email

- Image on website
- Print image in your closet
- Photobooks

Active

- ✓ Time, Cost & Complexity all low
- Explicitly add a backup step

Examples

External hard drive

- Copy files to external drive
- Backup software to external drive
- Free cloud storage
 - Copy your best to internet
 - Google Drive (15GB free)
 - DropBox (2GB free)
 - Microsoft OneDrive (15GB free)
 - Apple iCloud Drive (5GB free)

Foolproof

- ✓ Time, Cost & Complexity all medium
- ✓ When business or personal value is high

Examples

Multiple external hard drives

- External drives by year
- Rotating offsite drives

Cloud backup

- Purchase more cloud storage
- Google Drive (100GB \$24/year)
- DropBox (1,000GB \$99/year)
- Microsoft OneDrive (50GB \$24/year)
- Apple iCloud Drive (50GB \$12/year)
- Code42 CrashPlan (1 PC/unlimited GB, \$60/year)

Tip: Don't invest dollars unless you can invest time



Tip: share medium resolution images, e.g. 2000 x 2000 pixels

Tip: create private Facebook albums
